Installation

This plugin should be installed in the usual way using the e107 plug-in manager. It has been tested with version 0.7.2. I can make no guarantee that it will work with any other version of e107 even though it should.

Drop the prayer_menu folder into the 107 plugins folder and go to the plugin manager and install it.

Go to configuration and configure the plug-in. You will also need to create categories and prayers. If you want the menu shown go to menus in the main admin area and activate it.

In the Language file there is a definition for the heading in the request submission. To change it edit the line containing [PRAYERMENU_DISC](#).

Upgrading

When doing an upgrade follow this by doing an integrity check, database validity check and scan plugin directories and fix any errors.

Converted to version 0.7 of e107 and added a prayer expiry date.

About version 1.01

The prayer request menu allows you to have some prayer requests on your web site. Access can be restricted to a certain user class. You can specify who can submit new requests which are then saved but not made active. The administrator can review the prayers and approve or delete them as required.

Requests are displayed by category and can be sorted on request, poster's name or date posted. Request's body can use bbcode.
